It is agreed and understood that all medications, **prescription or non-prescription** will be provided by the parent/guardian in the original pharmacy labeled container, appropriately labeled with the students name, the prescribing physician, dosage, route of administration, and frequency of use. The parent/guardian agrees to pick up expired medication or unused medication within one week of notification by the staff. All medications must be picked up by the last day of school by an adult. Medications left at school will be destroyed. Medications will be kept locked in the health office and dispensed by the school nurse or trained school designee as per the orders noted above. By signing this Authorization and Release for Medication Administration form, the parent(s) / guardian(s) of the above student will release and hold harmless Resurrection Christian School, the school nurse, or trained school designee of any claim, demand or action associated with the administration or failure to administer the medication.

In addition, I give my permission for the school nurse to contact the prescribing physician with concerns or questions regarding medication and related medical monitoring.

No medications of any kind will be given at a student's request. If a student is required to take medication during school hours, an Authorization and Release for Medication Administration form must be completely filled out, signed by the student's doctor and a copy kept on file in the school office. The Authorization and Release for Medication Administration form must be submitted each school year for each medication. Unless your child has a chronic or acute health condition, please have your child take medication at home. Medications to be given 3 times a day can generally be given before school, after school, and at bedtime; in the case of antibiotics, this even spacing is preferable.
